

Criteria for current assessment students' learning activity in academic discipline “Human anatomy”

Ten (10) points are given to a student who showed exceptional and consistent understanding of the discipline, systematic, deep and complete knowledge of the topic, who perfectly knows anatomical terminology, and who has demonstrated all the required anatomical structures on the anatomical specimens and cadaver.

Nine (9) points are given to a student, whose performance met the requirements described above (for ten (10) points), but contained insignificant inaccuracies.

Eight (8) points are given to a student, who is generally competent in knowledge and skills, showed deep and comprehensive knowledge on the subject, but made small errors in explaining the material.

Seven (7) points are given to a student, who showed the knowledge that met the requirements for eight (8) points, but made small mistakes in explanation of material and demonstration of anatomical structures.

Six (6) points are given to a student, who is generally competent, but used wrong expressions or made mistakes in the description of the principles of an organ structure, errors in demonstration of some anatomical structures.

Five (5) points are given to a student, who showed knowledge necessary for the further study of basic and clinical disciplines and work in the specialty, but had significant difficulties in applying terminology, description of the structure and topography of organs, demonstration of anatomical structures on the anatomical specimens. used inaccurate names for anatomical structures, made mistakes in the

Four (4) points are given to a student who learned the basic amount of the studied material within the limits of educational standards, which allow him/her continue study at the medical school, but who showed insufficient knowledge of definitions and concepts, and superficial knowledge of structure of organs and systems, used wrong names for some anatomical structures, made mistakes in demonstrating them on the anatomical specimens.

Three (3) points ("Fail") are given to a student who demonstrated significant deficits of knowledge of learning material unacceptable for further study of theoretical and clinical disciplines.

Two (2) points ("Fail") are given to a student who lacked of knowledge in most learning material of the curriculum, incompetent in anatomical terminology and demonstrating organs and its parts.

One (1) point ("Fail") is given to a student who showed ignorance in the discipline or refused to answer.
