Name of practical skills	Form of practical skills control
1. Collection of pharmacological and allergological history	Performing practical skills at the patient's bedside
2. Analyze the action of drugs based on their pharmacological effects, mechanism of action, and pharmacokinetics	situational tasks
3. Selecting over-the-counter medications for the treatment of diseases based on knowledge of their properties and considering the basic principles of rational pharmacotherapy	situational tasks
4. Informing the patient about the nature of the action of the drugs, the rules of administration and possible side effects	situational tasks
5. Informing patients about the safety of using over-the-counter drugs	situational tasks
6. Informing the patient about taking medications depending on food intake, other medications and time of day	situational tasks
7. Assessment of the risk of drug interactions	situational tasks
8. Patient counseling on the over-the-counter use of medications in age and gender aspects, as well as in women during pregnancy and breastfeeding	situational tasks
9. Identify the symptoms of a disease that require a mandatory consultation with a doctor	Performing practical skills at the patient's bedside
10. Be able to complete a report of adverse reactions to medications	Completing an Adverse Reaction Report Form
11. Providing first aid to a patient in case of anaphylactic shock, uncomplicated and complicated hypertensive crisis, angina attack, bronchial asthma attack, hypoglycemia, fainting, heartburn, nausea, vomiting, headache	situational tasks
12. Evaluate scientific information on the effectiveness of drugs and other products, work with reference and other literature on drugs	Scientific research and interpretation of data on the effectiveness of drugs (reference medical literature, online databases)
