

Memo about student certification

At the Department of Microbiology, Virology, Immunology, the curricula provide:

1) current assessment (during the academic semester)

2) intermediate assessment in the following format:

- pass-fail test - credit (after the 1st semester of studying the discipline for students in the specialties of General Medicine and Pharmacy)
- exam

Current assessment evaluates the success of studying an academic discipline during the semester.

Control of theoretical knowledge is assessed at colloquiums. Control of practical skills is organized in the form of laboratory work in practical classes, individual practical work at colloquiums, and a practical skills exam.

If you missed a colloquium or have a negative mark for a colloquium and/or passing practical skills, you are allowed to retake colloquium before the certification date (the retake schedule is developed in agreement with the teacher of your group, no more than two attempts, the deadline is before the approved certification date).

Criteria for admission of students to the pass-fail test in the discipline “Microbiology, Virology, Immunology”

- Attended (or made up) all practical classes and lectures
- All laboratory works had been completed (laboratory work protocols have been signed in the workbook)
- Passed the current assessment and practical skills (marks "4" or higher).

Criteria for admission of students to the exam in the discipline “Microbiology, Virology, Immunology”

- Credit for the previous semester (except for students of the specialty "Dentistry")
- Attended (or made up) all practical classes and lectures (before the exam date)
- All laboratory works had been completed (laboratory work protocols in the workbook have been signed)
- Successfully passed the current assessment (grades for colloquiums “4” or higher)

The exam in Microbiology, Virology, Immunology is organized in 2 stages:

1. Practical skills exam (2 skills in the card)
2. Theoretical exam (4 questions in the card)

Students are allowed to take the theoretical exam if they have successfully passed the 1st stage (practical skills passed with a grade of “4” or higher).

Notes:

1. Questions for colloquia, a list of questions for credit, a list of practical skills can be found in workbooks and in educational electronic methodological complexes (e-test) for your specialty.

2. Student performance is assessed with the “Knowledge Assessment Criteria”

3. The final grade for the exam is given taking into account the “Student Rating” Schedule of credit, criteria for assessing knowledge and the student’s rating can be found in the “Information for Students” section in the electronic educational and methodological complex for your specialty and on the department’s page.
