

Rating System for Assessing Students' Knowledge, Skills, and Competencies at the Department of Microbiology, Virology, Immunology

Current and intermediate assessments are conducted using a rating system for evaluating students' performance. Students are permitted to participate in the intermediate assessment upon successful completion of the current assessment and evaluation of practical skills within the semester.

The formula for calculating a student's rating score for the semester is as follows:

Student rating = (average grade for practical classes * 0.3) + (average grade for colloquia * 0.7)

where:

- Student rating – the student's rating score for the semester,
- average grade for practical classes average grade for colloquia – the arithmetic mean score of performance in laboratory sessions,
- average grade for colloquia – the arithmetic mean score of colloquiums,
- 0.3 and 0.7 – weighting coefficients for the parameters.

The rating score is calculated to two decimal places in accordance with the rules of mathematical rounding.

The final examination score in the discipline is calculated using the following formula:

FINAL GRADE = (Student rating * 0.3) + (Skills * 0.1) + (Answer * 0.6)

where:

- FINAL GRADE – the final examination score in the discipline (reflecting the student's academic and research activities),
- Student rating – the student's rating score for the entire academic period
- Skills – the score for practical skills*,
- Answer – the score obtained for the oral response during the examination,
- 0.3, 0.1, and 0.6 – weighting coefficients for the parameters.

Notes:

1. The final examination score is calculated to whole numbers in accordance with the rules of mathematical rounding.

2. * Students are allowed to take the theoretical exam if they have successfully passed the 1st stage (practical skills passed with a grade of "4" or higher).

3. If a student's rating score in the discipline is at least 7 points and the score obtained on the examination exceeds the rating, then the score received on the oral examination will be recorded in the credit and examination register.

4. In the case of a retake examination, the rating will not be considered.
