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Method of calculating rating scores of educational and research activities of students in the disciplines “Human Anatomy” and “Histology, Cytology, Embryology” at the Department of Human Morphology

A final mark in a discipline is formed in the following way:
0,4 academic year rating score + **0,6** exam mark.

An academic year rating score R_c is calculated based on current academic performance and the results of final classes (FC):

In order to stimulate a responsible attitude of students to study, to increase the degree of student motivation, **penalties** are imposed for:

- ✓ unexcused absence at lecture – 1 penalty point;
- ✓ unexcused absence at practical classes – 1 penalty point;
- ✓ untimely work out missed classes – 0,5 penalty point;
- ✓ late pass of final classes – 0,5 penalty point.

*** Working off missed classes and lectures is carried out in accordance with the Regulation No. 575 on the procedure for reworking missed classes (approved by BSMU Order No. 879 from 30.08.2024).**

1. A student who scored 1-2 penalty units will not receive a penalty point.
2. A student who scored from 3 to 5 penalty units is awarded a **penalty point of 0,5**.
3. A student who has collected more than 5 penalty units will receive a **penalty point of 1**.

*** Penalty points are deducted from the student's rating for semester work.**

In order to stimulate the educational and research work of students, **bonus points** are awarded for:

- ✓ paper presentation in class – 0,2;
- ✓ paper presentation at a meeting of the student scientific society – 0,5;
- ✓ paper presentation at the student scientific conference – 0,6;
- ✓ paper presentation at the student scientific conference with a prize – 0,8;

- ✓ winner at the Republican Competition of student research papers (3rd and 2nd category) – 0,9;
- ✓ winner at the Republican Competition of student research papers (1 category, laureate) – 1,0;

* when speaking on one topic, bonus points are not summed up, a higher score is chosen

- ✓ publication in a collection of scientific works, abstracts – 0,3;
- ✓ publication of a journal article – 0,5;
- ✓ preparation of visual aids, educational and museum preparations from 0,2 – 0,5 (by the decision of the department).

*** The bonus point cannot exceed 1 in total.**

At the end of the 3rd semester, before the start of the examination session, each student in the "*Journal of attendance of practical classes, current student performance, exam results*" is given a rating score based on the results of the academic year, which consists of the results of current performance (table 1), availability penalty points (deducted from the rating score), bonus points.

The **final examination score** for the discipline (indicator of the student's educational and research activities) is calculated by the formula:

$$R_y = P_c \cdot 0,4 + O_3 \cdot 0,6$$

R_y – final examination score

P_c – student's rating for work in semesters 1, 2, 3

$0,4$ – coefficient of the weight of the indicator (educational and educational research work)

O_3 – the mark received on the exam

$0,6$ – coefficient of weighting of the indicator of the examination mark.

Notes:

• If a student receives an unsatisfactory mark on the exam, the rating mark in the discipline is not taken into account and an unsatisfactory mark is put on the academic record!

• If a student's rating score is not less than "7" and the score obtained on the exam is higher than the rating score, then the score obtained on the exam is put on the academic record!

• When retaking the exam, the rating is not taken into account!
