1. Sensory disorders. Perceptual disorders. Psychosensory disorders.
2. Disorders of thinking. Speech disorders.
3. Disorders of volitional functions. Mood (emotional) disorders. Attention disorders.
4. Memory disorders. Intellectual disorders. Disturbances of consciousness.
5. Panic disorder with and without agoraphobia.
6. Generalized anxiety disorder.
7. Social phobias. Isolated (simple) phobias.
8. Adjustment disorder with an anxious mood.
9. Obsessive-compulsive disorder.
10. Epidemiology, classification, and etiopathogenesis of mood disorders. Manic episode. Depressive episode.
11. Bipolar affective disorder.
12. Recurrent depressive disorder.
13. Reproductive cycle-associated depression in women. Premenstrual dysphoric disorder. Postpartum depression.
14. Chronic affective disorders. Dysthymia. Cyclothymia. Medical prevention of depression.
15. Suicidal risk. Suicide risk assessment and crisis intervention. Suicidal behavior as an extreme form of reaction to crisis. Types of suicidal behavior.
16. Anorexia nervosa.
17. Bulimia nervosa.
18. Binge eating disorder.
19. Sexual dysfunction not due to substance use or known physiological conditions. Prevention and treatment of mental disorders due to impaired physiological functions.
20. Dementia. Dementia in Alzheimer's disease. Vascular dementia.
21. Classification and mechanism of action of psychoactive substances. Syndrome of dependence.
22. Schizophrenia and related mental disorders.
23. Schizotypal disorder.
24. Common developmental disorders: classic/childhood autism (Kanner's syndrome), atypical autism (Pervasive developmental disorder not otherwise specified (PDD-NOS)), Rett syndrome, Asperger syndrome.
25. Neutralizing, supportive, and corrective therapy for mental and behavioral disorders. Classification of medications used in psychiatry.

- 26. Psychotherapy. The essence and rules of the main variants of psychotherapy: rational, suggestive, conditioned reflex (behavioral), autogenic training.
- 27. Electroconvulsive therapy (ECT).
- 28. Basic principles of treatment of urgent conditions (emergencies) in psychiatry.
- 29. Side effects and complications when using drugs that affect the central nervous system (neuroleptics, antidepressants, tranquilizers). Neuroleptic malignant syndrome. Serotonin syndrome.

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
