

Organization of the educational process at the Pediatric Infectious Disease Department

- The schedule of practical classes and the lectures are placed on the university website bsmu.by in the section “Departments” - “Pediatric Infectious Disease Department”
- All educational materials are available in electronic form at Etest.bsmu.by
- The students are required to attend **all** practical classes and lectures **in time according to schedule time**
- The missed classes and lectures must be made up for at extracurricular time within two weeks. The missed classes are covered up according to the PID Department’s schedule

During practical classes students should:

- Wear a **clean knee-length medical gown** or medical suit, and **indoor shoes** (shoe covers are not allowed). A cotton T-shirt should be worn under the medical gown (woolen clothes, clothes with a hood are not allowed). Clothing items often harbor germs. Wearing medical gown without washing it often enough can put a patient’s health in jeopardy!
- **Minimize or eliminate jewelry**, sleeves, and additional accessories, as they also can transmit germs.
- **Long hair** should be **tied up**, **fingernails** should be **cut short**.
- During practical classes students should have **stethoscopes, medical flashlight, pen, textbook and workbook**.
- During patient’s examination students should wear **masks** and sometimes **medical gloves** (for rash examination). Medical gown should be **buttoned**.
- Photographs of medical records are not allowed.
- Smoking on the territory of the hospital is not allowed.

In case you don’t have necessary equipment (all listed above) you will not be allowed to patient’s examination and receive negative grade for your practical skills.
